

Narration

Seven hundred years before the birth of Jesus, the prophet Isaiah spoke the good news for all nations.

Recitation Isaiah 60:1-3

"Arise, shine, for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord rises upon you. See, darkness covers the earth and thick darkness is over the peoples, but the Lord rises upon you and his glory appears over you. Nations will come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your dawn.

Narration

Just as the glory of the LORD led the Israelites out of the bondage in Egypt, now Jesus was born to free all the people of the world from sin, death, and the power of the devil. God so loved the world. Tonight we rejoice with all Christians as we sing Christmas songs from all around the world.

Narration

Christianity came to the African continent quite early. In the book of Acts, a man from Ethiopia heard the gospel message from Philip. This song from Cameroon carries the same gospel message.

Narration

Thousands of years ago, God gave his prophet Isaiah a sign to know the promise of Immanuel "God with us" was coming. Two thousand years ago God sent the Angel Gabriel to Mary and Joseph to announce the birth of the Savior Jesus.

The time for the glory of the LORD to be revealed had come. The redemption of all people from sin had come. The prophet Isaiah spoke of the sign. God sent the angel Gabriel to Mary and Joseph to announce the good news.

Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign: The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel.

Narration

Mary responded to this good news with faith and joy. Listen to this modern version of her song, the Magnificat, set to a Scottish hymn tune.

Narration

The time had come for the Baby Jesus to be born. The setting was a lowly stable in the village of Bethlehem. This traditional Hispanic lullaby "Duérmete, Niño Lindo" celebrates our love for baby Jesus. Duérmete, Niño, lindo, en los brazos del amor mientras duerme y descansa la pena de mi dolor.

Recitation Luke 2:1-7
Grades 3-4

In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. (This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria.) And everyone went to their own town to register.

So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no guest room available for them.

Narration

From the quiet of this Bethlehem night, we move to a lively and upbeat carol from the West Indies. We will hear how Mary treasured and pondered the details of Jesus' birth. But, Christmas is also a joyful celebration. This next carol comes from the jubilant Caribbean culture.

Anthem

The shepherds came where the baby was born. And they say that his name is Jesus. Refrain

God's love came to the world through the gift of His Son, Jesus. No one on earth needs to be terrified by sin or the circumstances of life and death. God's angels brought the good news to the lowly shepherds.

Recitation Luke 2:8-12

Grades PreK-2

Grade K

And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified.

Grades 1,2

But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord.

Grade PreK

This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger."

Narration

Like the shepherds, we know and trust the good news of Jesus. Like the shepherds, we leave the things of this world simply to follow Jesus. This African American spiritual reminds us to follow Jesus as the shepherds did that night.

Anthem

Rise Up Shepherd and Follow (African American Spiritual)

Grades K-8

There's a star in the east on Christmas morn, Rise up shepherd, and follow. It will lead to the place where the Savior's born, Rise up shepherd, and follow.

Refrain

Follow, follow, Rise up, shepherd, and follow. Follow the star of Bethlehem, Rise up, shepherd, and follow.

If you take good heed of the angel's words, Rise up shepherd, and follow. You'll forget your flocks, you'll forget your herds, Rise up shepherd, and follow. Refrain

Narration

The shepherds heard the most incredible angel choir singing God's praises, telling of the peace the Savior would bring to all nations. Glory to God in the highest! This traditional French carol proclaims the angel's words in its Latin refrain: Gloria in excelsis Deo!

Hymn

346 – Angels We Have Heard on High Grades PreK-8 and Congregation

Angels we have heard on high, sweetly singing o'er the plains, and the mountains in reply, echoing their joyous strains. Gloria in excelsis Deo!

Shepherds, why this jubilee? Why your joyous strains prolong? What the gladsome tidings be which inspire your heavenly song? Gloria in excelsis Deo!

Come to Bethlehem and see him whose birth the angels sing; Come, adore on bended knee Christ the Lord, the newborn King. Gloria in excelsis Deo!

Grades PreK-2

Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests."

Fearful were the shepherds, awed and full of dread.

"Do not be afraid", the shining angel said. "Come to David's city,

Light of all in darkness, Savior of our race.

Recitation Luke 2:15-20
Grades 3-4

When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about."

So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger. When they had seen him, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child, and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them. But Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen, which were just as they had been told.

The shepherds returned home after seeing the Christ child. But they did not go quietly. They returned glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen. Throughout all time, Christians have worshiped God. They cannot stop glorifying and praising God for the gift of Jesus, our Savior. This well-known spiritual song comes from unknown origins. Somewhere in early America, Christians were praising Jesus with this song, and we continue to praise today.

What Christmas joy we have as we echo the angels' words! God's plan to rescue the world from hell was fulfilled. God's love sent His only Son for us. He willingly made the sacrifice to welcome us back into his family so all people might sing a song of eternal joy. Listen to this Mandarin carol from China.



The most famous Christmas carol was written for Christmas in 1818 by Joseph Mohr, the pastor at St. Nicholas Church in Oberndorf, Austria. On December 24, Pastor Mohr gave a poem to organist Franz Gruber and asked that he set it to music with guitar accompaniment. On the same evening, Mr. Gruber gave the simple composition to his pastor.

When they saw the star, they were overjoyed. On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh.


